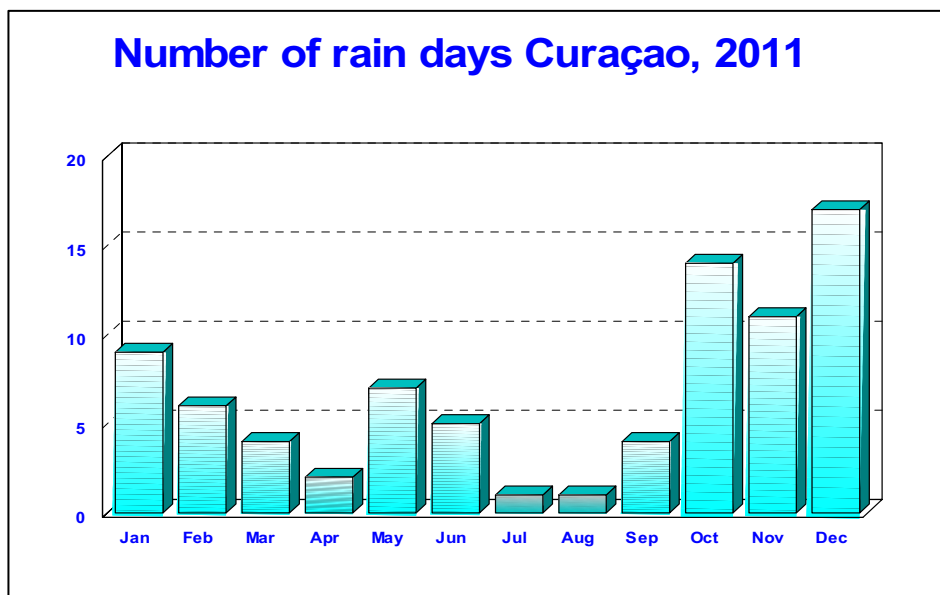
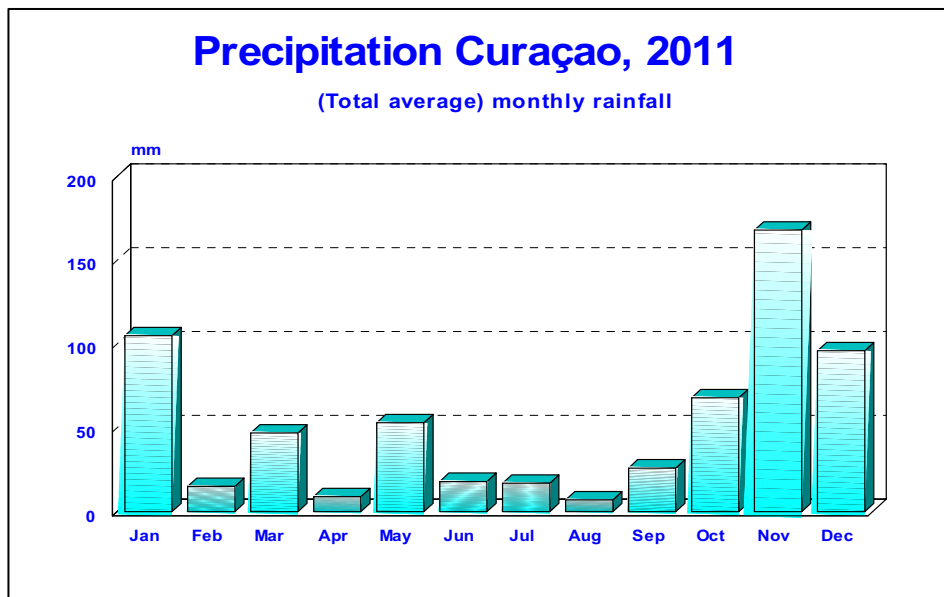
1499	Discovered by Alonso de Ojeda. Spaniards settle on Curaçao.
1634	The Dutch conquer Curaçao. The ties with the Netherlands have continued till the present day, with the exception of two short periods, from 1800-1802 and 1807-1816, when the British ruled over Curaçao.
1800-1802	First British occupation
1807-1816	Second British occupation
1863	Slavery abolished
1954	The Netherlands Antilles (Curaçao, Aruba, Bonaire, St Maarten, St Eustatius, Saba) are granted internal autonomy within the Kingdom of the Netherlands.
2010	The Netherlands Antilles are dissolved. Curaçao and St Maarten become autonomous states within the Kingdom of the Netherlands, a similar status as that of Aruba, whereas the smaller islands Bonaire, Saba, and St Eustatius become Dutch municipalities.

Government

The Head of the State is Queen Beatrix of the Netherlands. On Curaçao she is represented by a Governor. The Head of the government of Curaçao is the Prime Minister.

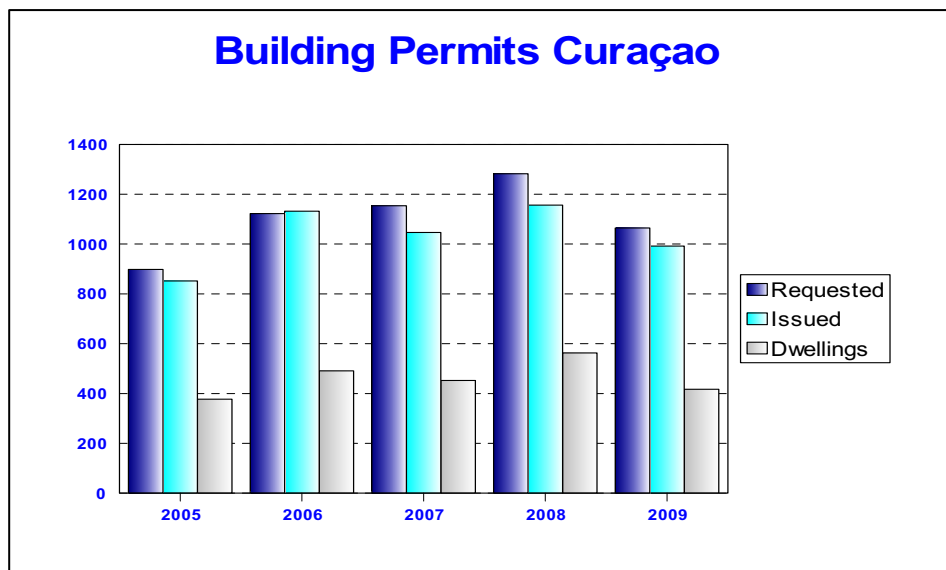

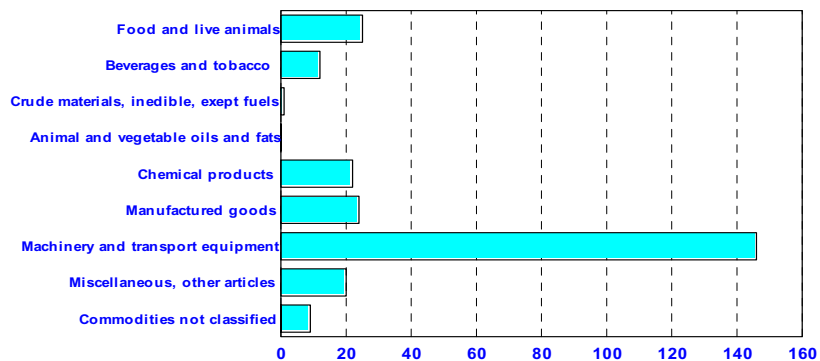
